PUBLIC HOURS RANGE RULES

For General Public Access Shooting

THE RANGE OFFICER (RO) HAS THE RIGHT TO INTERPRET THESE RULES IN THE INTEREST OF SAFETY. THE RANGE OFFICER ALSO HAS THE RIGHT TO EXPEL AND/OR REFUSE SERVICE TO ANYONE.

All persons using the Range must first sign the SIGN-IN SHEET with a legible, printed name and signature. **Signing-in indicates that the person has read and will comply with all rules and regulations and acknowledges acceptance of the range liability waiver.**

1. All shooters must check in with the designated Range Officer at the range before shooting. Shooters will conduct themselves in an orderly manner at all times and will be responsible for the conduct of any guests they bring with them.
2. The word of the Range Safety Officer is FINAL.
3. **ABSOLUTELY NO alcoholic beverages, drugs, or persons under the influence of alcohol or drugs, are permitted at the Range.**
4. No smoking, eating, or drinking is allowed inside the Range.
5. **Ear and eye protection are required for all persons at the Range.**
6. **FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION: All firearms must be in good working condition.**
 - a) Black powder firearms are not allowed.
 - b) RIFLES: Only .22 caliber or smaller **rimfire rifles** may be used (i.e. 17HMR; 17HM2; 22WRF; 22WMR). In SCVRC-owned firearms, only .22 caliber long rifle ammunition approved by the RO may be used. Air guns, including compressed gas, pneumatic, and CO₂ guns, of any caliber may be used.
 - c) PISTOLS AND REVOLVERS: **No centerfire magnum calibers allowed.** Otherwise, all calibers, .17 through .45, firing a projectile with a muzzle energy less than 450 ft-lbs, are allowed {energy_{ft-lbs} = (V²_{ft/sec} x Mass_{grains})/450400}. Magnum caliber pistols using non-magnum ammunition are allowed.
 - d) SHOTGUNS: Any shotgun may be used. The RO must be notified that you will be using a shotgun. Only lead shot up to size 00-buck may be used. **NO STEEL SHOT, SABOT BULLETS, OR SLUGS ALLOWED.**
 - e) AMMUNITION: Ammunition must be in safe condition. **NO CENTER-FIRE MAGNUM LOADS ARE ALLOWED. NO PAINT-BALL OR AIR-SOFT STYLE AMMUNITION ALLOWED.**
 - f) MAGAZINES: For Safety, the Range Officer may limit the capacity of magazines to a maximum of 10 rounds.
7. All firearms must be transported unloaded and in a case (pistols or rifles), or muzzle-up with the action open for rifles, whenever entering/exiting the Range. Muzzle-up with action/slide open when moving between firing points inside the Range.

8. All firearms not actively in use must be unloaded with actions open, resting in either the rifle stand or on a shooting bench with muzzles pointed downrange, or stored in their case.
9. No junior (a minor under 18 years of age) may use any firearm unless accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. A junior accompanied by **any other adult** must have in their possession a written, signed statement by that junior's parent or legal guardian granting permission to use the **specific firearm(s)** (Sec. 12101; 12072; 12078; 12552, California State Penal Code). Juniors enrolled in marksmanship courses or a Hunter Safety class must have a signed State of California Permission Registration Form.
10. Only shooters, RO's, and coaches or mentors are permitted beyond the yellow READY line. No more than three people are permitted at one shooting station at any one time. Young children (<12 yrs old) who are not directly involved in a shooting activity must be supervised by an adult who is not engaged in a shooting activity. Children under the age of 6 are not permitted inside the range facility.
11. Absolutely no unauthorized persons are permitted beyond the **RED** firing line at any time.
12. **Live Fire Sessions: Do not load your firearm until authorized to do so by the RO.**
Specific Range Commands:
 - a) **CEASE-FIRE:** all shooters shall **immediately** stop shooting, remove his/her finger from the trigger, and freeze. Shooters must wait for further instructions from the RO. All range users have the right and responsibility to call a "CEASE-FIRE" should they observe any unsafe condition.
 - b) **UNLOAD AND SHOW CLEAR:** all shooters shall unload their firearms, open all actions, bench or rack their firearms, and step back from the firing line. **Absolutely no one may approach the shooting bench or handle any firearm during a cease-fire period following this command.**
 - c) **YOU MAY COMMENCE FIRING:** Shooters may load their firearms and begin or resume firing when ready. Only the Range Officer may give the command "**YOU MAY COMMENCE FIRING.**"
13. All shooting must be controlled and directed specifically at approved targets downrange. No "RAPID FIRE", "QUICK DRAW", "FANNING", "HIP" or "MOVIE" style shooting is allowed.
14. No holstered firearms.
15. Fire only at your target. Firing is allowed only on official NRA or other RO approved targets. Targets must be positioned all the way down range unless authorized by the RO. Human photograph or realistic human silhouette targets are not allowed.
16. Do not distract any shooter while he/she is in the process of loading, aiming or firing.
17. In the event of a misfire or jammed firearm that cannot be cleared by the shooter, immediately bench the firearm with the muzzle pointed downrange, and notify the RO.
18. All brass except your own belongs to the Range. **If you do not take your brass with you it must be placed in containers specifically labeled for brass.** Do not place aluminum or steel cases in the brass containers. Misfired or damaged ammunition **shall not** be placed in brass or trash containers and may be turned in to the RO for proper disposal.
19. Aluminum or steel cases, trash, paper or other combustible materials must be placed in trash containers separate from those used for brass.
20. No solicitation on Range property allowed. Groups using the Range during general public hours shooting are not permitted to make collections, charge admission, sell tickets or refreshments, solicit funds or raise money inside the Range.
21. The San Jose Municipal Firing Range, the City of San Jose, and the Santa Clara Valley Rifle Club assume no responsibility for injuries or lost or stolen items at the range.

RANGE FEES: Adults, \$10.00 per hour; juniors, \$1.00 per hour. Fees are pro-rated at half-hour intervals after the first hour. Eye and ear protection are available at nominal cost.

GENERAL PUBLIC ACCESS: Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, 6:30 to 9:30 PM; Saturday, 2:00 to 5:00 PM. Additional public access may be available either on a walk-in basis during certain events or by specific appointment (WWW.SCVRC.COM).
